

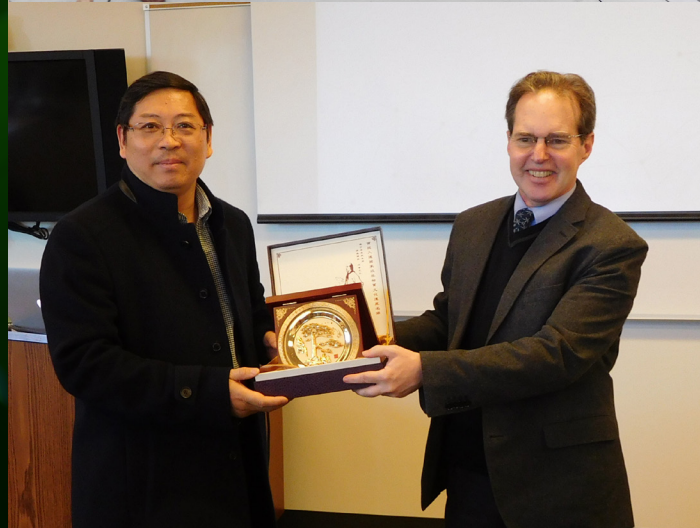
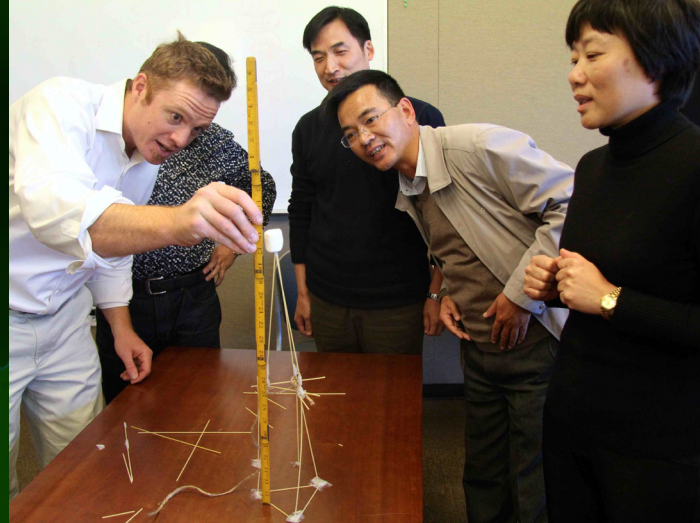
# HIGHER EDUCATION ADMINISTRATION *U.S. Education*

## Program Description

This two-week program gives participants first-hand knowledge of how U.S. universities operate across a wide range of administrative, teaching, and research functions. It is designed for administrators, professors and researchers in higher education with the knowledge, skills, perspectives, and strategies necessary to lead effectively in the globalized world. Participants will attend lectures led by American faculty, visit different campuses and facilities as well as have face-to-face discussion with American professors and students.

- English proficiency not required, translation provided

- Critically analyze key issues and trends in US higher education
- Describe the similarities and differences between the US and home country's education systems
- Reflect on learning theories and instructional techniques
- Develop and facilitate innovative learning communities
- Lead sustainable change initiatives
- Develop multicultural competencies
- Improve English language abilities
- Explore collaborative relationships with US universities
